# PNW, COP and Synod News and Notes

✓ Our Generous God! We thank God during these challenging times that the ministry of our congregations and schools has continued. On this note, we join in praising God for moving the hearts of our WELS constituents in giving generously to our Synod's joint work (CMO) in 2020 and the first 3 quarters of 2021. Congregation Mission Offerings are ~7% above plan for 2021 and ~5% above actual giving for the same period in 2020. This, coupled with some reduced expenses (lesser travel, etc.), has resulted in financial blessings for our joint work. O Give thanks to the Lord for he is good!

- Synod Convention the initial response to the altered format for last summer's convention was positive. The reduced number of onsite attendees due to COVID, forced floor committee to do their work early via zoom. This introduced committee members to one another and prepped them well for their area of work prior to the convention. This may be a feature that will continue in some way for future conventions. 2023's convention is scheduled for Saginaw. As promised, all 2021 delegates will have the option to be delegates again in 2023.
- $\checkmark$ NPH – a new curriculum 22:6 (Proverbs) is in the initial planning stages by NPH. This would be a comprehensive curriculum for Lutheran Schools and Sunday Schools. Some goals would be: have complimentary materials (not overlapping), help our children meet 21<sup>st</sup> century challenges and equip them to share / defend their faith in today's culture. Building a child's foundation in God's Word is the key to prepare and equip students in this world of change. This project would take 4-6 years to complete. Keep this planning and effort in your prayers. The new hymnal is completed. Over 56,000 have already been shipped out to schools and churches. Director, Pastor Michael Schultz and his entire committee have been thanked. Over 100 people and 13 different committees were involved in this extensive effort that took ~10 years to complete. Thanks to God and his gifted people for producing this tool for our worship and ministries. Retirements: President Bill Ziche and Vice President of Publishing, Curtis Jahn have announced their retirements for Dec. 31, 2021. They will assist until replacements are in place. On this note, the NPH Board of Directors began conducting a search for a replacement last July. However, to date no suitable candidate has been found. The greatest challenge in filling this position is that it requires the candidate to be a voting WELS member with experience in leading a business organization or business unit within an organization. The position is an important one as the NPH President, in collaboration with the NPH VP of Publishing, will lead the Synod's publishing efforts forward through continuing publishing industry changes while pursuing new opportunities to meet the needs of our WELS pastors, schools, and members. The publishing house needs your help in getting the word out to eligible candidates who have a desire to utilize their business experience and skills to serve their Lord in a ministry setting. Please share this opportunity with your congregations as together, we consider men who may be qualified for this position and encourage them to apply in the careers area on wels.net.
- World Missions there has been a COVID delay in the construction of the Vietnam facility to train future pastors of the Hmong Fellowship Church. During the delay ~60 pastors have been trained to preach and teach the saving gospel. We will learn more on the building progress in the coming months. The calling for missionary manpower is moving ahead in London. There is a current group of WELS members there and the plan is to reach more with the gospel. This effort will allow the European Chaplain John Hartwig to focus on serving others in Europe. Finally, sometimes our stateside churches connect with overseas prospects through online efforts. World Missions offers a loving caution that before bringing overseas personnel into membership, it would be wise to seek WM's assistance to determine their potential status and fellowship with a foreign church body.
- Home Missions An effort to plant 100 new missions in 10 years was approved by the 2021 WELS convention. Over the past decades WELS opened ~60 new missions. Manpower and finances are two major factors in this plan, the former perhaps more challenging than the latter. We keep this vision and effort in our prayers. Recently, a new home mission plant was approved for financial support in Collinsville, IL. Enhancements were also approved for Crossville, TN and Summerlin, NV and unsubsidized mission status for Good Shepherd in Beloit, WI. May God bless all our congregations as they support mission work in their local congregations and across our Synod.

✓ Principal Vacancies as of early Oct. in WELS are ~35; additionally ~10 pastors are currently serving as principals in a permanent situation; teacher calls are now picking up again with the calling window opened; 60+ call meetings took place on October 10; 15 were planned for Oct 17; we thank God for the faithful service of the CLS Staff: Jim Rademan, Paul Patterson, Cindi Holman and their support staff members. We also are deeply grateful for the MLC staff who, together with CLS, offer great support to the DPs across our Synod to serve our schools. Pastor Vacancies across the synod remain high (see chart); the recent change in vacant parishes isn't a reflection of fewer vacancies but a net result of mergers and closures; in 2018, the acceptance rate for pastors accepting calls

was ~22% (1 in 5 calls extended); in 2021, the acceptance rate for pastors dropped to ~12% (1 in 8 calls extended). These number totals are the DP's best estimate. Pray for workers for His harvest field!

  - Worship plan that introduces the hymnal in two ways a conservative or more aggressive approach
  - Series for sermons & worship for every season in the church year
  - Preacher's Podcast parish pastors and Sem profs discussing a recommended sermon text
  - Daily devotions produced by Commission on Discipleship will follow weekly worship themes
  - Promotional and outreach material for all the series: professional graphics, promotional text & videos
  - School and chapel devotions based on the worship series
- ✓ CMO Subscriptions and Statistic Gathering it's that time of year again when pastors and principals are asked to support and communicate 2021 fruits (stats) and 2022 gift plans. Both categories are vital to planning gospel ministry now and for the more distant future throughout our Synod. We thank our congregations for their encouragement, gifts and support. Please note the deadlines for submitting these numbers in upcoming communications from our MCG chairman, Pastor Chris Ewings. Pastors assist greatly in getting these numbers pulled together NOW so there isn't a last-minute rush to meet deadlines in Jan.
- Pension Plan Approved The 2021 WELS convention approved the proposed plan to move away from a defined benefit pension program to a defined contribution pension program. Between now and the end of 2021, all congregations are asked to be sure their workers are enrolled in the new plan. BPO will also ensure that every called worker is enrolled in the new pension program. - Equipping Christian Witnesses Congregations are being urged to consider an offering to the ECW campaign at Martin Luther College for a) student financial support b) new dorm on campus c) note: groundbreaking was held on April 10 for the new field house which has been fully funded. A campaign toolbox is available on MLC's website for ECW promotional materials.

- ✓ Male and Female in God's World The COP has spent (and will spend more) time reviewing and revising the document based on good feedback. We want to "do it right" rather than "do it quickly." Progress is being made to incorporate good input from around our Synod. Please pray for our COP's Doctrinal Cmt. and their work with this document. May God give them wisdom to be faithful to the Scriptures and speak clearly to our culture. Also, in response to the Synod's Convention resolution, the COP Doctrine Cmt. is pulling together resources that will serve as a biblical guide on the topic of The Divine Call and our current practice. More information will be shared in the future.
- ✓ WELS National Conference on Lutheran Leadership is being planned for January (Mon. 16 Wed. 18?) 2023, at the Conrad Hilton Hotel in Chicago. An audience of 1200-1500 is being targeted (entire hotel). Cost would be similar to the last LL conference. Keep this in your prayers and pencil in those dates.
- Calls Extended by COP at the October Fall Meetings, divine calls were extended to Rev. Matt Vogt to serve as an assistant congregational counselor; a new position approved by the SC to assist Congregational Services in serving churches; we extended divine calls to Rev. Mark Wessel to serve as a Christian giving counselor in Mich./N.Atl. and Rev. Stephen Hein in AZ-CA.
- ✓ High Callings a pastor and teacher's high calling as a public servant of the gospel is to proclaim the gospel on behalf of their church or school and serve as Jesus' ambassador. Out of love for Jesus, we are wise to avoid posting personal viewpoints, political positions or opinions on medical issues involving Christian freedom such that our office or the name of our calling body is compromised. We never want to put an obstacle in the way of the gospel for others. This is a great discussion that called workers will want to have with their spouses as well. Thank you.
- Personal Biography Info A link is available to all WELS Called Workers via <u>My WELS Cloud</u> to confirm and periodically update your contact and biographical information. Please update your contact info whenever there is a change (address, phone, birth, etc.) and also update your self-evaluation forms annually with review by your Circuit Pastor, Principal or ECE Director. Updated AND completed bios are integral pieces of information to those who develop call lists. Thank you.
