Active Teacher Calling Window

Please be reminded, the window for calling active teachers from the field who would begin serving in a new location for the 2022-23 school year begins on **October 10, 2021**, and runs through April 14, 2022. The volume of teacher calls remains high and congregations are encouraged to plan ahead, keeping the following in mind:

- Teacher call list requests are submitted electronically at wels.net/ callrequest
- Request forms must be complete and submitted at least 14 days prior
 to the requested call meeting. Calling bodies should use the two
 weeks to prepare all items for the call packet electronically, so that the
 call and accompanying documents may be emailed to the candidate
 called within 12 hours of the call meeting.
- Remember to include compensation informatiom using the compensation calculator: cwcompcalc.wels.net.

Training Future School Leaders

The Principal Credential Cohort program invites individuals who have demonstrated three or more years of successful teaching expierence, recognized leadership gifts and characteristics, and are not currently serving in a principal role to participate. The cohort provides support from mentors and fellow participants, three leadership training events and a 50% scholarship for graduate coursework through MLC.

The Emerging Leader Cohort for early childhood directors provides opportunities for those either not currently serving as an early childhood director or new to the director role with professional development and training.

Looking for a way to improve your school? Consider WELSSA! Accreditation gives your school a structure for improvement over time. It is like a personal trainer or a diet program. While some can improve their health on their own, many need the accountability of a partner. Accreditation is your partner for school improvement. It combines identifying areas for improvement with accountability for addressing your plan to tackle those challenges. It frees you from the burden of having all the answers but can move your school forward with the assurance that you are working on the things that will improve your school to God's glory.

Gaining WELSSA accreditation also earns you accreditation recognition with the National Council for Private School Accreditation (NCPSA).

As a synod, 51% of Lutheran elementary schools and 100% of Lutheran high schools are accredited with WELSSA or another accrediting body. There are currently 149 WELSSA accredited schools (132 LES, 16 LHS, 1 standalone ECM) in 14 states serving over 20,000 students. There are 13 schools holding candidacy status that will be hosting a first-time site visit within the next two years. There are 40 regular site visits and three early childhood addendum visits scheduled for 2021-22. More than 175 experienced educators from schools around the country will volunteer to serve WELSSA as a consultant, site team captain, or team member this school year. WELSSA is thankful for their service. May God continue to bless WELSSA!

This summer WELSSA hosted a captain's retreat. The visitation team captains reacted to some proposed changes to our standards and gave feedback on future improvements. This fall the Commission on Lutheran

Schools approved some minor adjustments to our current standards and a rewrite of the Early Childhood Addendum to the Lutheran Elementary School Standards. The Addendum allows a school that is currently accredited for grades kindergarten through eighth grade to add the preschool grades to their accreditation without going through the entire Early Childhood Ministry standards. It is also used for schools seeking 3K through eighth grade accreditation.

Another important change the Commission approved in September is the removal of Exemplary Status. The following rationale was considered:

- None of our NCPSA partners awards this status.
- Over 60% of WELSSA schools have achieved this status. This statistical anomaly infers that our measurement of exemplary is flawed.
- Multiple exemplary status schools have reported that achieving the status has been a factor in not seeking continued improvement.
- Our visitation captains have reported that they have seen an inflation in WELSSA scores due to real or perceived pressure to mark all asterisked standards met, which is a prerequisite for exemplary status.

Our next steps are to continue revisions to our standards and related materials, to study the use of consultants, and to evaluate the number of starred standards currently required in our handbooks.
