Lutheran Schools Task Force Work

WELS schools served over 44,900 students last school year, with over two thirds of WELS schools (Pre-k - 12) across the country reporting enrollment growth. The growing enrollments along with teacher retirements and resignations left our WELS schools needing about 300 (or 10%) new teachers for the 22-23 school year. Candidates trained at MLC and assigned in May filled many vacancies, but many schools still had teacher needs. We are thankful for the seventy-five WELS-trained former teachers who have returned to the classroom, and the one hundred five WELS members who were called to serve in our schools for the first time. We praise the Lord for the growing opportunities to share Jesus daily with more and more souls in our schools, and we are thankful that teachers have been provided for our classrooms. A teacher shortage task force was appointed by President Schroeder back in late May and will report to the Conference of Presidents in October. Educators from across the country along with representatives of MLC, Ministerial Ed, the Commission on Lutheran Schools, and the Conference of Presidents who make up the task force have been looking closely at multiple data points and have been considering recommendations regarding recruitment, teacher retention, and teacher training pathways. We ask the Lord's blessings on the work of all our teachers and this task force.

Christ-light and Christ-light II have served WELS schools well for decades. Much has changed in our schools and who and how we serve over those decades. A task force of teachers and pastors with members representing early childhood, elementary, high school, Martin Luther College, and the Commission on Lutheran Schools has been assembled and is laying the groundwork for what we believe will be a dynamic curriculum to help meet our needs now and into the future. Watch for updates in the months ahead on the work of this important task force.

WELS early childhood ministries provide blessings and opportunities to share the gospel with young children and their families. A group consisting of one district president, two early childhood directors, and the CLS office is working on ways to assist congregations and their leadership in supporting and encouraging those who serve in an early childhood ministry. Resources and individual support are being considered as they continue their work.

An early childhood training task force including nine ECM directors and MLC professors met over five months to review the training needs of currently-serving early childhood teachers. Using a 2022 survey, they identified the needs and recommended strategies to meet them. The task force report is being used to plan appropriate continuing education.

Active Teacher Calling Window

Calling bodies may extend divine calls to active teachers, pastors serving in high schools, and staff ministers serving in school settings from **Oct. 12, 2022** through **April 16, 2023**. The increased teacher demand, combined with a shortage of teachers, has required some updated guidelines, and new considerations for calling bodies to recognize. Here are some expected new normals:

Calling bodies should submit their electronic call request at wels.net/callrequest at least two weeks in advance of the desired call date. Calling bodies should wait for an email confirming the call date prior to scheduling or announcing the date of the call meeting. Call volume and calls with similar qualifications on a given day may require an alternate date.

The number of candidates presented to the calling body may be less than in the past, as the Conference of Presidents seeks to maintain and provide a viable pool of well-qualified candidates to meet the growing number of call requests.

Calling bodies should strongly consider requesting local candidates currently not serving in a called position in a WELS school.

Calling bodies should alert their district president and the Lutheran Schools office at lutheranschools@wels.net immediately after their call meetings to provide the meeting results, as many candidates presented for their list, but not called, may be on a call list the following day.

Calling bodies should expect that their call list of candidates will be provided electronically by the district president on the day of the call meeting.

WELS School Accreditation (WELSSA) is celebrating 20 years of recognizing organizational quality and driving improvement in our Lutheran schools! We are grateful for the blessings our work has received from God and desire to be your partner in supporting excellence in your school ministry.

Accreditation carries many benefits. By comparing and aligning your school to our standards, you can have the confidence that your school is meeting the needs of your learners and their families. In addition, accreditation helps focus your school on improvement areas through the self-study and visitation process. Prioritizing areas to address is valuable for both new and veteran school leaders. Accreditation is also an important validation for your graduates as they move through the educational world. Accreditation can also improve your school's bottom line. Certain state programs and grant opportunities are only available to accredited schools. Finally, as our schools reach into the community to share Jesus with their education program, accreditation provides credibility to people unfamiliar with our school system and assures them that they are receiving a quality education. Since WELSSA is recognized by the National Council for Private School Accreditation, your school also receives national recognition and valuable oversight for WELSSA processes and standards.

In an effort to continually improve WELSSA, our site visit captains met this summer to provide valuable feedback on the forms, self-study process, and direction of WELSSA. In addition to offering insights and recommendations for improving the school visit, the captains reviewed a new template for the self-study and the results of the LES Starred Standard review team. The team recommended keeping just over half of the starred standards. About one fourth of the starred standards were removed until the wording could be revised. Additionally the team recommended that the Commission remove the stars effective immediately and that a committee be assembled to review the standards that need revision.

Over the next several months, our attention will be to complete the starred standard review for the ECM and LHS Standards, study and amend the role of the consultant, develop suggested evidence lists for LES and LHS standards, and appoint a team to review the LES Standards.
