Grace Lutheran Church, Portland, OR – Pastor Thad Bitter

Ministry at Grace in Portland continues to be filled with blessing and challenges. In the past few years God has blessed us with the opportunity to make several improvements to the ministry facilities at our church and school. Most recently, the dedication of a new digital / hybrid organ and balcony renovation at Grace Church has been a tremendous blessing. Along with a very talented group of worship musicians and organists, worship at Grace continues to blend all the gifts of music together each Sunday. Attendance in worship in 2016 is thankfully up as in-reach and outreach efforts continue to be blessed and some wonderful WELS transfers have move to the Portland area. However, significant transfers out have proved challenging as God's people move to other parts of the country. Grace is currently creating a two year Stewardship plan and planning to participate in the Praise and Proclaim outreach in the next year. New approaches to weekly bible studies will also emphasize outreach and stewardship. Grace school continues to be a great blessing by providing opportunities to reach out with the Gospel and nurture many families in the Portland area. While enrollment is down and we face some significant financial challenges we remain thankful for all the blessings God gives us through our school. Next year, Grace School will open a new chapter in its history as staffing changes and realigning classrooms wll allow Ryan Schlemling to transition into the role of full time Principal while Mark Leitzke will teach a $6^{th} - 8^{th}$ grade room. In the fall of 2016 Grace will begin offering before and after school care with the hope of expanding our ECE program to include fulltime childcare beginning the 2017-2018 school year. We continue to trust in God when there are challenges and thank him for his blessings!

Immanuel Lutheran Church: Salem OR – Pastor Craig Wasser

The Lord's blessings are numerous. We have welcomed 20 new souls into our walk with Jesus since January 1. This brings with it many new opportunities for growth and sharing the gospel. Our Elementary School continues to serve as a great blessing to our ministry as well. This past year we enrolled and served a record number of children. Our School is adding a playground this year after five years of raising funds. We raised \$29,000 for the entire project. We thank God for his grace. We continue to face the reality of revolving staff. Last year we did not replace the manpower of our former Principal after he took a call to Manitowoc Lutheran High School. This year we are not replacing the manpower of our Pre-school teacher or our Vicar. These changes place a heavy load on our current staff. We pray for God's Blessings. Our future planning consists of an all member stewardship emphasis. The key focus will be on financial giving. We do not have a line of credit and we are seeking to increase giving to a level where we can fund our \$500,000 budget without borrowing during months where we have lower income. We also will continue to explore reaching out to Albany Oregon with the gospel. Finally, our congregation is going through a self-analysis. We want to improve on many areas of our ministry, build on our strengths and better address our weaknesses as a congregation. May God continue to bless us.

Trinity in Eugene underwent a transition in August 2015 when Pastor Jay Blum retired from 31 years of faithful service as pastor.
